## **SECURITY BULLETIN - Revised**

## **SUBJECT:** New Fingerprint Requirement – Every 2 Years

A new TSA regulation requires fingerprint-based Criminal History Checks (CHRCs) every two years for those with airport issued security identification. The new regulation becomes effective Monday, July 27, 2015 and will affect the RENEWAL process for airport badge holders.

**Non-Airline Employees** (excluding government and law enforcement officers) must be fingerprinted at the time of renewal. Badges will be issued while the results of the new CHRCs are being reviewed.\*

**Airline Employees** will be required to provide a new Airline Certification Letter at the time of renewal which includes the <u>fingerprint</u> <u>date</u> as well as the fingerprint case number. Badges cannot be renewed if the employee's fingerprint results are more than 60 days old.\*

**Government Employees & Law Enforcement Officers** are exempt from the new regulation but must use the new multi-purpose badge application form starting July 27, 2015.

## **IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW**

The outcome of the CHRC review may result in suspension or revocation of badge.

\*Badge holders who present EXPIRED badges to the Badging Office on or after July 27, 2015 MUST BE <u>FINGERPRINTED</u>, <u>WAIT</u> for fingerprint results to be approved <u>BEFORE</u> a new badge can be issued. *Exception: Airline employees who present CHRC certification letters indicating fingerprints were submitted within 60 days of badge expiration date.*
